Victim First Monthly Newsletter – August 2024

Case Study

This service user was a victim of **ongoing racial harassment** from her neighbour, which involved threats towards her and her family, banging on her door and harassing her in the street.

Upon contact with this service user, she reported that she felt uneasy, restless, and **terrified to be in the house.** The service user and her family was struggling to complete daily tasks such as going to school and doing their shopping.

Our caseworker **provided a listening ear**, where the service user could speak about how she was feeling, particularly when feeling overwhelmed. Advocacy was provided in the form of a **housing support letter**, and through contacting her local MP and the local antisocial behaviour team. Information on her rights as a victim were also provided.

At the end of support the service user reported that she felt that she was listened to and we understood what she was saying. The local MP has spoken to her and actions were being taken. The service user **thanked for Victim First's support** and now knows where to turn to if she needed support again.
